PURPOSE | TE PŪTAKE

- 1. The scope of this workshop is to share with Elected Members the draft Climate Action Plan via workshop Wednesday, 23 October 2024.
- 2. The Climate Action Plan has been reviewed by Officers and redrafted to reflect the direction of Elected Members. This work has been completed by the Integrated Growth and Planning Team but sought advice from Officers across the organisation amongst its development. The plan explored the opportunities, objective and scope of actions to address climate change concerns within our district. Drawing on the knowledge of regional partnerships, the plan looks to localise action, based on the Horowhenua environment, within financial expectations.
- 3. Officers in developing this work have completed two Council workshops (29 March 2023 and 15 May 2024), and two Council reports (25 October 2023 and 8 May 2024), in relation to climate change, regional partnerships, the carbon emissions portal, and budget to establish and build on the work of the Climate Action Plan.
- 4. Officers welcome all feedback on the draft Climate Action Plan, with particular focus on the development of the actions. The eight themes of the actions were agreed upon at the May Council workshops, with recommended changes made following Elected Member feedback. The categories within the table demonstrate the avenues for actions including the potential time of implementation, cost and impact. Alongside the Long Term Plan, Council documents and Climate Action Plan the actions have been written in a way that crosses the organisation and recognises opportunity for partnership.
- 5. Officers would like to seek feedback in particular on the inclusion of the Climate Action Fund (community grant). Current scope is for applications to be considered they must show connection to the eight values/initiatives of the Climate Action Plan, and benefit of implementation within Horowhenua. Applications for projects outside of the district will not be considered for this fund, neither will ideas that do not align with the eight actions of the Climate Action Plan or the approach. The grant will be to the value of \$500-\$2500, awarded from the Climate Action Fund.
- 6. The intention of the Climate Action Fund (community grant) is to provide seed funding for not-for-profit climate action projects in the Horowhenua District.
