11.30AM Water Consumption: Installing Restrictors on Rural Properties - Part B

These workshops outline the current situation (Part A) and potential future approaches (Part B) to enforcing the regulations involving rural water restrictors on properties connected to the Council water supply. It explains how existing requirements, intended to ensure fair and sustainable water use, maintain water pressure, and prevent use for stock or horticulture, have not been consistently enforced, and why this is important for growth and network performance. It also presents three potential options: fully enforcing current regulations, applying enforcement on a case-by-case basis, or removing restrictors altogether, each with associated trade-offs relating to cost, fairness, infrastructure requirements, and impacts on the water supply network. Officers will be seeking feedback and direction from Elected Members on next steps.
